CHAPTER 8 CHARITY

One of the most important missions of The Mexican Connection is the charity donations in \$ and in-kind that we provide for the Mexican people in the area of our Rally. Over the years we have supported schools, orphanages, old people's homes, special education schools, clinics, and many other worthwhile institutions.

The Wagonmaster during the scouting trip(s) puts out feelers for possible recipients for charity donations and during the Rally the Charity Committee seeks those out and finds more and/or other institutions. We do not give to individuals.

Rally participants have always been extremely generous, not just in dollar donations, but with in-kind donations as well.

We welcome school supplies, toys, sporting goods, laptop computers, new or used (in good condition) clothing especially for babies, children and teens, beauty and health care products (soap, shampoo, skin crème, toothbrushes and paste etc., adult diapers) and many more products, which are expensive in Mexico and can be put to good use. Also certain foods like peanut butter, cereals, etc. are always welcome. If there is a Lions Club, eyeglasses and hearing aids can be used.

We also hold at least one live auction, and ask all Rally participants to bring something useful for an RVer--wine, food etc. Our auctions are always a lot of fun and we generally get a lot of money—dollars, pesos, checks, everything is welcome!

The Charity Committee makes sure that all monies are efficiently used. We often go shopping at the local Wal-Mart or Mercado, to buy the things the recipients need, or we even have paid the utility bills for a couple of months. We also make sure all the in-kind donations go to worthy places. If possible, Escapees CARE in Livingston, TX may receive a donation from Chapter 8.

To all San Felipe Rally registrants: Please bring as much of the above mentioned articles, as you can, and bring your wallet—there may be something in the auction you always wanted!!! Remember, like our late member Roger "Spook" McFillen used to say: "It's for the Kids!"

Please do NOT bring really old and useless stuff—especially no old and worn clothing. The Charity Committee has to sort out all the donations and will appreciate your cooperation.


The Treasury records also show that 41 individuals or families have renewed their dues or joined the chapter during this fiscal year.

\$882 has been collected or allocated so far this fiscal year for the Charity fund to be distributed to needy causes in San Felipe as to be recommended by the Charity Committee and approved by the General Membership.

Since a large mission of Chapter 8 is to help the people of Mexico especially in the towns where we hold our annual rallies, all members are encouraged to add Charity donations to their dues payments or rally fees and of course plan on bidding aggressively during the charity auction to be held during the rally. THE METRIC SYSTEM

Distance

1 kilometer = 0.62 miles 1 mile = 1.61km

Volume

1 liter = .26 US gallons 1 US gal = 3.79 lt

Weight

1 kilogram = 2.21 pounds 1 lb = 0.45 kg

Temperature

F° to °C [(F°- 32) x 5/9] °C to F° [(°C x 1.8) + 32]

Formula for translating cost of pesos per liter to dollars per gallon at the gas pump:

Price per liter (pump price) x 3.79 (liters per gallon) \div exchange rate of pesos per dollar or: $P \times l \div e = \frac{g}{gal}$
