

Our pre-rally will be at Organ Pipe Cactus National Monument in Ajo, AZ. On February 6th we will travel in small groups to Puerto Penasco, and rally on the beach for ten days.

Our location, The Reef RV Resort, has proven to be very popular. Located on Sandy Beach, the park has two great dining venues adjacent to the park which we are sure will be very popular with our members.

Fun Places to Visit in Puerto Peñasco!

We've visited Puerto Peñasco several times including the Chapter 8 Rally there in 2012 and eally enjoyed the town! Here's a few of our favorite places to visit in this port town on the Sea of Cortes! First, all RVers like to eat and Puerto Peñasco has many places from taquerías to fancy restaurants to satisfy you!



We liked *Pollo Lucas Asadero*, a very good restaurant right on the main drag, Blvd. Benito Juarez. Look for the large open front, thatch roofed chicken (pollo) barbeque restaurant with the delicious smell of barbequed chicken, rice, beans and tortillas in the air! Downtown near the water on Calle Francisco Eusebio Kino (Padre Kino St.) is a small but excellent taquería, *Asadero Viva Mexico*, that has terrific and inexpensive grilled carne asada and pollo tacos with all the trimmings—yum!





As you walk around downtown, you'll come across a large plaza with several large monuments. One is called El Camaronero (the shrimp fisherman). Many large festivals are held at this plaza throughout the year! Other things to do here are renting a PWC or go up in an ultralite aircraft, and as you would expect, sport fishing is very big deal here with a fleet of boats available in the harbor.









If nature is your thing, and it is for us, Puerto Peñasco has a variety of interesting sites including El Pinacate Biosphere Reserve, that protects a large volcanic area complete with a huge crater, El Elegante, (above) many cinder cones and lava fields along with beautiful unspoiled Sonoran desert with almost every cactus variety, some of which should be blooming in February!




The port is famous for their shrimp boat fleet as well as many other fishing vessels, assuring you of the freshest possible seafood in the restaurants here.



A boat trip from the harbor will take you to Bird Island, a rocky group of small islands with nesting grounds for many sea birds, including blue-footed boobies (shown) and several large colonies of

The Aquarium in Puerto Peñasco is small but has some interesting

CEDO is a conservation organization as well as a nature center with many interesting displays including the sealife and whales of the Sea of Cortes and a great gift shop too! One of their focuses is protecting the highly endangered small dolphin, the vaquita, found only in the waters in the vicinity of Puerto Peñasco.







Aquaculture in the form of an oyster farm close by CEDO is interesting to see the process of growing oysters and then eating them at the nearby cafe.







And finally, we want to mention Chapter 8 Charity here in Puerto Peñasco. One example is Escuela de la Montaña (School of the Mountain) is a school for mentally and physically handicapped kids. Like most schools in Mexico, the Mexican government builds the buildings, supplies teachers and books, gives a minimum of food and pays the electric bill, leaving the teachers to fundraise for all enrichment items, more food and art materials. Handicap equipment such as wheelchairs and walkers are always needed as well as art materials. In 2012 we bought them a van load of art supplies, a refrigerator and other kitchen equipment, several walkers and

much more. The Charity Committee will make visits to a number of institutions that need help and we encourage you to come along and see for yourself the smiles and friendliness of the people and children and the conditions under which they operate. You'll see why many of us think Charity is the most heartwarming thing Chapter 8 does!





Mexico check list

Mechanical Needs

Everyone is responsible for keeping his rig in good running condition. Have vehicles serviced and checked over before leaving home.

The following is suggested:

- Tune-up
- Oil and filter change
- Air filter change
- Gas filter change
- Lubrication
- Wheel bearings checked and/or packed
- Inspect all hoses under the hood and replace if unduly soft or brittle
- Inspect all belts and replace if frayed
- Check all fluid levels
- Check wiper blades and replace if necessary
- Check shock absorbers and replace if necessary
- Check and clean battery terminals, check fluid level and general condition
- Check front end alignment
- Check tires for condition and pressure, including spare
- Check turn signals, tail lights and brake lights
- Check wheel lug nuts for tightness

Inspect trailer and fifth-wheel springs carefully for any cracks or bad bushings. Chances are if they are 8-10 years old and have had considerable use, they will break somewhere that you won't want them to. If one breaks, the others will soon follow.

Suggested spare parts to bring are:

- Belt 1 spare for each one under the hood
- Air filter 1
- Tire 1 one for each size on vehicles and trailers
- Jack 1 heavy enough to lift a corner of your rig
- Lug wrenches 1 for each size nuts on vehicles and trailers
- Hitch ball 1 if pulling trailer
- Hoses 1 for each under the hood
- Keys 1 spare set
- Oil enough for a change, plus extra for emergency
- Oil filters 2
- Fuel filters 2
- Flashlights 2 plus extra batteries
- Distilled water for batteries
- One trailer springs and shackle

In case of breakdown the Wagon Master will assist you to get it going, or will see you to a mechanic. Then it will be up to you. Green Angel trucks provided by the Mexican Department of Tourism travel main highways to help travelers in need. The drivers are bilingual and have simple spare parts, tools and radios for obtaining other assistance if needed. Tips are accepted.

Communications

CB radios and Family 2-way radios will be used for communicating while the caravan is on the road. Be sure to have one of each that works.

Leave the Club phone numbers, (800) 474-2252 and (707) 374-5511, with family and friends. We will try to locate you in case of emergency.

Arrange for Mexico coverage with your cell phone service provider.

Many RV parks in Mexico now have WiFi.

Towed Vehicle

If you have a small vehicle which you tow behind a motorhome it is recommended that you bring it for convenient transportation out of campgrounds.

Services

Mexico is a foreign country that does not have the same standards as the U.S. or Canada as far as services for electricity, water, etc. There will be dry camping and camping with facilities that may or may not work all the time. We recommend you buy purified water. Arrangements can usually be made in campgrounds to buy it from vendors who will pour the five-gallon containers into your rig.
