Our group worked so well together that much got accomplished. We had a couple of meaningful Executive Board Meetings before the rally start. An "All Special Volunteers Welcome" Brain storming session as to the future of Chapter 8 created a smooth and harmonious way to get the job done. I am so proud of all who contributed... way to go Board Members, Group Leaders, Charity Committee, Tail Gunners and Parking Chairs working in sync so beautifully!

We also had our 35th Chapter Anniversary celebration at Potrero Park!





Our Chapter was started by an intrepid few SKPs while traveling in Mexico who thought it would be great to share the ins and outs that make RVing in Mexico special! Thirty-five years of introducing new RVer's to travelling in Mexico and passing it forward through Chapter 8 to the next group of newbies. This is really something of which we can all be proud. Many friendships have been made on each side of the border. Chapter 8 also added Charity (hands-on projects and cash donations from our famous & fun SKP auction) in the last decade or so to our mission statement. Consequently, Chapter 8 has provided the opportunity to offer safe and fun rallies and caravans to thousands of Mexico-savvy SKPS for three and a half decades!

Many of you are aware that the Escapees RV Club had decided to have multiple competing commercial Hangouts or Xscapers Convergencies in San Felipe during our traditional rally dates. Given the continuing success of recent Chapter 8 Rallies & Caravans, it was no surprise that SKP interest in Mexico would proliferate... which is why Chapter 8 started in the first place. However, there is a difference between meeting up with a group of SKP friends to party South of the Border... and the Chapter 8 Rallies that not only enjoy fiestas with old and new SKP friends... but also dive into local culture, get tips on how to travel safely, explore the unusual, and lend a hand or a peso where it is

needed most. And since Chapter 8 is part of the non-profit Escapees Social Network, Inc. and all of our leaders are non-paid volunteers... our rallies and caravans provide more fun, adventure and information for your travel dollar.

You can read the letter (later in this newsletter) that was sent to the Escapees RV Club Leaders from our Chapter in hopes of better coordination for future events so that we help each other attain our different goals. I am sure many of you understand that Baja California is currently our safest area to live up to our mission statement (introducing RVer's to travelling in Mexico). Mainland Mexico (outside the Free Travel Zone of the Mexican States of Baja California, Baja California Sur & parts of Sonora) is currently not suitable for our Chapter as a gentle introduction to travel in Mexico. The Free Zone has fewer Mexican travel restrictions & fees, a fascinating variety of sights and scenes, plentiful U.S. made ULSD diesel and Top Tier gasoline, and warm-hearted locals who are especially welcoming to Chapter 8 Members. That all adds up to having our rallies and caravans in the Free Zone where we can create more effective introductions to Mexico's people & places, customs & "carnivals," and unique experiences that commercial tours have yet to find.

Treasurer's Report April 2020 by Steve Bufty

The Treasurer says ... our annual Rally in Mexico was again a very successful and joyful event thanks to the great volunteer efforts by the entire group of Rally attendees from the Wagonmaster, to the Board Members, and to all the participants who jumped in to help with the many facets of this great event.

Even though the destinations for this year's Rally were a repeat of the previous year, it was like doing the same thing over again but for the very first time. That was partially attributable to a mix of old and new attendees, old and new events, and everyone pulling together as a team to make it a successful and fun Rally.

We visited Baja's Guadalupe Valley and the Punta Banda area south of Ensenada. In the Guadalupe Valley we had a wonderful visit to the Zoologico Parque del Niño where everyone enjoyed the interaction with the staff and the animals. In the nearby area we all enjoyed restaurants and of course wine tasting at L.A. Cetto Winery. And at La Jolla Beach Camp south of Ensenada we enjoyed the beach, participated in charity events, experienced local restaurants and scenery, experienced a fabulous off-road trip where no one drove over a cliff this year \bigcirc , and soaked in the overall ambiance of seaside Mexico.

Financially, \$16,651.00 flowed in for the Rally and \$17,557.01 flowed out, and in the end our records all balanced to the penny with the Rally producing a small net loss of \$906.01 which was well offset by gains from the Rallies of the previous two years. The big numbers that we can all be proud of were the charity amounts where we raised \$8280 through direct donations, auction sales, and even a haircut challenge (you had to be there!)

Along with charity "seed money" passed forward from the previous Rally, and a slightly larger amount of "seed money" passed forward to next year's Rally, we were able to distribute a total of \$8000 in monetary charitable donations this year. These donations included \$1000 to a **Scholarship Fund for Higher Education**, \$100 for supplies to a local **Battered Woman's Shelter**, \$1500 to purchase two

washing machines plus fans for the local Casa del Abuelas old age home, \$1500 for the Christmas Basket Fund for the Needy in the local Punta Banda community handled by Miguel Pabloff, a \$600 contribution to the Gertrude Pearlman Theater for costumes for the Groupo Folklorica, and \$2300 to the Zoologico Parque del Niño Jersey for needed supplies for the staff and the animals. The net result was that the Rally raised enough charitable funds so that in addition to the local Mexican charities that we all supported, we were also able to send a \$1000 donation to Escapees CARE as we very much like to do each year.



Aside from the monetary contributions listed above, we also donated a large amount of what we call "inkind" donations which are material goods such as food and clothing that will be reported by the Charity Committee. We also had a large group of volunteers who armed themselves with all the tools necessary and in one smooth operation installed drywall in one of the new buildings being built for the needy seniors at Casa del Abuelas. And while many labored with the drywall, others entertained and comforted the seniors who seemed extremely appreciative of the attention and diversion from their day-to-day existence. Good job everybody!



Service Committee Chairperson Report by Nancy Hoult

"Travel South of the border and give back more than the enriching experiences we gain, through charity donations and business patronization." These words from the Chapter 8 Mission Statement sum up the work of the Service Committee. This years' service and charity work reflected the good character and generosity of all who attended. Our Charity Committee includes Nancy Hoult, Committee Chair, Steve Bufty, Treasurer, Donna Patten, Dory Johnson, Gary Hatt, Ed Dennis, and Kassandra Dennis, Chapter President. These hard-working committee members created so many opportunities for the Rally members to serve and donate goods, time, and money to improve conditions for the people we encountered in Baja Mexico.

One method of contributing to the locals is through "in-kind" donations - that is, new and gently used clothes, computers, pots and pans, sports equipment, school supplies, as well as food with a long shelf life. The Rally members donated goods valued at \$2300 and many of these items were donated to a charity home for the elderly, Casa del Abuelas. They loved the coloring books and blankets! Basketballs and soccer balls as well as food went to families in a local migrant worker camp. Clothes for women and children were sent to a local home for battered women.

The largest fund raising effort is the annual auction where members bid outrageous prices for goods donated by other members, like a \$100 baseball cap with "Mexican Connection 2020" embroidered on it.







To make It even more fun our auctioneers and "Vanna's" dressed up in eye-catching costumes as they elicited excitement and competition from the bidders. Our "bartender" Jean sold margaritas to the happy bidders. The proceeds benefited the local children's dance group, Groupo Folklorica, the zoo we visited in Guadalupe Valley, Zoologico Parque del Niño Jersey, a local scholarship fund for high school students, and our own Escapees CARE organization. In addition the money was used to purchase washing machines and fans for the Casa del Abuelas and contributed to Christmas baskets distributed by Miguel Pabloff, owner of LaJolla Beach Club.

Many rally members see the service project as a highlight of the trip. This year a handy group of our men and women installed insulation and painted trim in a 6 bedroom group home at the Casa del Abuelas. While that was going on others were visiting with the grandparents. We visited with one bedridden man who spoke great English. As we passed out blankets, sweaters, and some colorful bracelets to a large group, some were able to communicate in Spanish or just smiles. Then Malcolm Russ tuned up his violin and played many hand-clapping tunes. Everyone brightened up and several started dancing to the happy tunes. No language barrier there!





Service is a major goal for the Mexican Connection Rally and 2020 turned out to be a record-breaking year for generosity and charity given with a smile.

Dear Shawn and fellow Escapee Leaders:

Since 1985, Chapter 8 has spread the Escapee Spirit of Joe & Kay Peterson with non-profit RV Rallies in Mexico. Over the years, thousands of Escapees have learned how to travel safely in a foreign country without a single negative event of any consequence. In the past decade, Chapter 8 has added charity to our Mission Statement benefitting Escapee's CARE as well as nonprofit charities south of the border keeping the spirit of Joe & Kay alive with tens of thousands of dollars. But, being an Escapee in the Spirit of Joe & Kay is more than legacy in giving, it is a legacy in growing within ourselves and helping our fellow SKPs grow in a way of which we can all be justly proud. As we have grown, so have other branches of the Peterson SKP Tree... and conflict has grown where harmony reigned for thirty-five years.

Ideally, The Mexican Connection picks a new destination every year and Chapter 8 has gone as far as Mexico City with over 150 RVs. But in recent years, internal changes within Mexico such as declining oil production led to the introduction of Ultra Low Sulphur Diesel from the U.S.A. further constricting areas of safe refueling. Areas of relative safety, abundance of facilities and ease of access further limit practical choices for bringing first timers to Mexico as related in our Mission Statement. The Mexican Government declared a small "Free Zone" to encourage vehicular tourists to the Baja Peninsula and parts of Sonora further constricting the prime areas during temperate weather for Mexican Hangouts, Convergences and Chapter 8 Rallies.

Our Chapter's recent multi-year revitalizing effort is paying off with increased enthusiasm and energy from the Executive Board through to a resurgent swelling of our membership and Facebook participation. As loyal SKPs with long memories, we recognize the necessity of having forprofit components of the Escapees RV Club and many of our members are Xscapers as well. Although Chapter 8 started out as an integral part of the Escapees RV Club, in recent years we were repurposed as a chapter of the Escapees Social Network, Inc. Here we have the opportunity to follow the Spirit of Joe & Kay but within the non-profit course of a 501(c)(9) owned by the Escapees RV Club. Thus, by Escapees RV Club design, we cannot be the profit centers that Hangouts and Convergencies can be... though we pay our own bills, follow the path of Joe & Kay for our fellow SKPs, and provide services and financial benefits to others along the way.

The popularity of our unique Caravans, Rallies, and Add-on trips to Mexico has spilled over into a demand for Hangouts and Convergences that are direct competition to the few destinations and similar times as our annual

events through which we rotate. Consequently, the ability of our unpaid volunteers to continue our chapter (once Escapees' largest) is being undermined by lure of Mexican "party hearty" hype that detracts from cultural, historic, philanthropic, and international relations opportunities.

The Mexican Connection is all about having a great time in Mexico... and learning how to travel, shop, relate with the locals, see the sights, and lend a hand or a peso where it is needed along the way. Last year we reconstructed and repainted a rural school playground, donated school supplies to students, and provided costumes and shoes for a children's Folklorico Dance Heritage group. Our advice and support for a unique non-profit Children's Park and Zoo over the past three years culminated in the award for the Best New Exhibit of all the Zoos and Aquaria in Mexico... and the plaque of the exhibit honors the Escapees RV Club, Chapter 8.

This year, we purchased and installed fiberglass insulation for a new building for the needy elderly, gave scholarships to outstanding students, used Amazon to deliver needed supplies to a children's learning center, and provided special needs for a battered women's shelter. We also provided a Food Bank for the hungry and blankets, clothing, and shoes to those whose makeshift homes we visit. Each year we generously provide special funds to Escapees' CARE from our annual Charity Auctions. Everywhere we go in Mexico we leave behind Escapees decals and fond memories for those whose lives we touch... as we ourselves are also touched by who we have grown to be.

Jim & Lockie Sailor can attest to the quality that the volunteer leaders of Chapter 8 rallies provide to fellow Escapees and the good will we create for the Escapees RV Club south of the border. Last year, as in previous years, Chapter 8 sponsored a Mexican Connection Fiesta Social at the Escapade with poignant scenes from our 2019 rally with Mexican food & drinks for over 200 smiling SKPs! However, we cannot compete with SKP Hangout & Convergence publicity.

In 2020, three other Escapees events directly competed with our 35 year old traditional February rally. Consequently, our website, Facebook page and Chapter officers were blindsided with Hangout and Convergence SKPs asking for guidance from their fellow Mexican Connection SKPs... and we served them too. That meant that we had to alter our plans, lose some of our confused members to competing Escapee/Xscaper events and change our event to a shorter main rally with innovative add-on extensions to exotic locations. Despite the turmoil that led to fewer participants, our 2020 Baja Adventure was one of the best ever... and proudly raised a record amount of goods, services and cash for charitable events on both sides of the border.

Our rallies often grow to being two or three times larger than a typical commercial rally. When commercial rallies are going to places we might go, we communicate together for everyone's benefit since large campground facilities are relatively rare in Mexico. At the very least, it would seem that the various Escapees for-profit and non-profit events should coordinate the timing and destinations of activities in Mexico so all Escapees could benefit in future years... and allow the legacy of Joe & Kay to continue to be the force behind our Mexican Connection!

Dear Kassandra,

Thank you for taking the time to write to the Escapees Board of Directors with your thoughts and concerns regarding event opportunities in Mexico. We want to start this letter by expressing our appreciation for all the years Chapter 8 has served Escapees and provided an incredible opportunity for our members to be a part of. It brings us great joy to hear that you are thriving and seeing increased enthusiasm, and we hope that you only continue to grow with each passing year.

With that said, we hope to clarify a few misconceptions you might have about Mexico Convergences and Hangouts, or those programs in general. We hope you realize that it is not, and never will be, Escapees intention to take traction away or lure people away from any of our Chapters. We can assure you that if our Event Directors or attendees from these events have asked questions regarding Mexico in any Facebook pages, that it was with the sole intention of partaking in the Escapees caring and sharing attitude, not to harm your efforts. We would hope that anybody from your Chapter would feel comfortable enough to ask questions to the community, wherever they see fit. We are all in this together; and, we should be fostering conversations to help one another.

It is very important to us that Escapees Chapters continue to thrive, and it is a topic that comes up often in our board meetings. We have always pushed our members to look into Chapter opportunities; and, specifically, when it comes to Mexico, we always tout Chapter 8 and the great work you all are doing on your trips. More importantly, our Event Directors plug you guys to their attendees while in Mexico. We can sympathize with your feelings and interpretations of what we are doing with our events. But again, it is not our boards, nor our Event Directors, intention to take away from your Chapter/rally.

We feel it is worthwhile noting that our Event Directors do work hard to bring volunteerism and help to local communities into all of their events—Mexico is no exception. They organize volunteer/donating efforts where possible; and, they also work with local restaurants and businesses to bring our attendees to them or organize event activities. Contrary to what some might believe, Xscapers events do not revolve around partying. Our members are passionate about getting together as a community and giving back anywhere possible.

When it comes to timing, we are working on a schedule between our other events so there is only a limited timeframe that we can book our events in Mexico. This is for the benefit of the Event Directors and the attendees who attend multiple events within a few months' time. Again, it is not our intention to overlap with your rally; and, we will try to be more conscious of this moving forward, but we cannot guarantee that there will never be conflicting dates.

We feel it might be helpful to share some background about why Xscapers and the Hangouts came to be. As an organization, we were missing the mark on providing our own internal resources for certain demographics of RVers. Our number 1 priority as an organization is community. And, at the end of the day, we were not meeting our own needs. With the creation of Xscapers, we were able to provide a niche atmosphere for working RVers. As time went on, there were a lot of members who found themselves at those events, but felt they did not fit in. They also did not feel that HOPs or Chapters were what they were looking for either (though we sure encourage them to try them all). Thus, the ideas starting formulating for a program that would eventually turn into Hangouts. Events have always been in our wheelhouse, and this is just a natural progression of expansion for the organization. The point here is, Xscapers is not for everyone. Hangouts are not for everyone. Chapters are not for everyone. Our goal was to create as many opportunities as possible so that the members can choose what works best for their needs and lifestyle. No program should be intentionally harming each other. Rather, they should be working together to provide the best experience possible for their respective communities.

The last major point we wanted to address are the comments about Convergences and Hangouts being a profit center for Escapees RV Club. While we don't feel the need to dive too deep into details, we would like you guys to know that it's a false statement. The priority of these particular programs is providing a means for Escapees members to get together, and we strive to keep them as affordable as possible for members. We work hard and make sacrifices as a business to make this happen, which is why we feel the need to address it.
