Recap of the 2023 Puerto Peñasco - San Felipe "Vamos a Baja"

A total of 41 rigs of all sizes and types and 63 participants were at the Rally this year. Interestingly, there were an equal number of couples and solos among the participants. On Valentine's Day at the Hickiwan Trails RV Park in Why, Arizona, the board members and volunteer teams greeted the arriving participants. Over the next two days, orientation focused on traveling into Mexico, getting the FMM cards, separating into the travel groups, checking CBs, and more.



On February 17th, at 6:00 am, the first group headed for Puerto Peñasco in Sonora, Mexico, after crossing the border at Lukeville, AZ. It was only a short two-hour road trip away after that. After we settled in at Playa de Oro RV Park, we carpooled to the Welcome Dinner at Casa del Capitan at the top of "Rocky Point" overlooking the Sea of Cortez and our RV park. Old Port, with many restaurants and shops, was a fun place to explore. Another shopping area, "Rodeo Drive", was enjoyed by many as well for innumerable souvenirs and metalworks. One evening we went on a sunset cruise along the coast with snacks and



margaritas flowing, but everyone stayed safe on the return in hired vans. Many attendees went to a Tequila tasting at the Tequila Factory and learned all about flavored Tequila. On a City Tour, we visited the port, saw a large whale skeleton, toured a seashell museum, and topped it off dining al fresco along the sea at JJ's Cantina.

As we do at every rally, we had our auction to raise money for charities. Many volunteers stepped up to make this event a success. At an afterschool facility for abused children,



volunteers built 10 garden boxes out of concrete blocks and rebar. The children will use these to grow

vegetables to sell to local restaurants and learn how to help support their families. It was a long hard morning that was well worth the time and energy. That afternoon, volunteers were able to visit the care facility and spend time with some of the young clients served by this charitable organization.

After a fun-filled week, the groups headed to San Felipe. This part of the trip was expected to take five hours, with a few stops along the way. Let's just say it did not go as planned. At Victor's RV Park, the beachside barbeque welcome dinner was very delicious, but some of the groups were still on the road when it started. Throughout our week, we had an Ice Cream Social, a blind wine tasting event, the General Meeting, a cooking class (ceviche,



so yummy), toured the giant cactus park, and visited an oyster farm and a salt production

facility. Additional charity work was completed at an orphanage near San Felipe. Volunteers painted two buildings and distributed knitted hats to the children. We also did other fun things together in smaller groups like visiting the local brewery where one of our members even joined the band onstage to much applause!



When the rally ended on March 5th, several groups headed to add-on destinations, some headed north back to the USA, and others spent additional time in the San Felipe area.

2024 "Return to San Carlos" Rally

Plans for next year's rally are progressing nicely. The rental agreement with the Santa Cruz Fair Grounds is complete. For the three days of introductions and orientation to traveling into Mexico, we have 70 dry RV sites and a hall reserved for us at the fairgrounds. One of the agenda items is breaking the RVs down into small traveling groups of around eight rigs each for the travel to Guaymas. Each

will have an assigned Group Leader and a Tailgunner to keep the group on track during the 5-hour trip.

Detailed information will be presented at the Orientation Meeting. Two things are very important: 1) a working CB is mandatory to keep in contact with your group, and 2) we would like to group together the drivers that wish to drive at slower speeds. There will be a questionnaire on the registration form asking about your specific talents and abilities. Please answer all the questions so that we can have the groups separated to the best advantage for all.

We will be exchanging pesos at the orientation. I've found it simple enough to go to your own bank. We use Chase Bank and they need a minimum of three-day lead time. We personally will get \$500.00 in pesos before the orientation rather than exchanging at the orientation. As this Rally will be on toll roads (with nicer roads) pesos will be needed for the tolls as US dollars aren't accepted. Don't worry, we will have the



information regarding the specific amounts needed for the tolls on this trip at the orientation.

Another requirement is purchasing the Multiple Immigration Form card (FMM) in order to stay in Mexico more than 72 hours. If you are close to a border town before the Rally, get them then.



For us personally, at Los Algodones, we walk across the border, obtain the FMM card, then have a morning of shopping, followed by lunch.

These are NOT things you need to do beforehand. We will make stops to get your FMM cards and exchange money. It's just that the more of us that have this completed, the less time we will be at the border. Remember this is a five-hour trip.

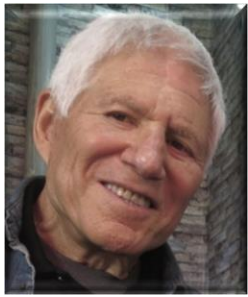

... first, a point of clarification ... our Escapees Mexican Connection memberships run concurrent with our

fiscal year which is May 1st through April 30th because our fun-filled Rallies in Mexico are typically in February and March. All memberships paid at any time in the current calendar year are good for the rest of the current year and run through April 30th of the following calendar year.

We currently have 115 paid-up memberships that run through or beyond April 30th of 2024. Notices were sent to those whose memberships were due to expire as of April 30th of 2023, and a bunch of those folks did respond and renew. Many of the current memberships run through future years. Membership fees are \$10 for one year, with special pricing of \$25 for 3 years or \$40 for 5 years.

Current Article 2, Sub. 2.2

2.2 The Executive Board shall consist of at least (3) officers but may contain more. Officers can include the President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Secretary, Treasure, Assistant Treasure, Immediate Past President, Newsletter Editor, Membership Chairperson, Historian, and Webmaster. These officers shall constitute the Executive Board. Any two offices may be held by the same person but that person shall have only one vote on the Executive Board.

Proposed change

2.2 The Board shall consist of at least (3) officers but may contain more. Officers can include the President, Secretary, Treasure, but may contain more. Additional officers may include First Vice President (Wagon Master), Second Vice President (assistant Wagon Master), Membership Chairperson, Charity Chairperson and Immediate Past President. Any two offices may be held by the same person but that person shall have only one vote on the Board.

The Board will have a quorum of at least 50%, in person, by email, phone, or any combination thereof.
